And with great anticipation, here are the trivia answers!!

- 1. When did the first US auto accident happen, and where did it occur? In 1891, James William Lambert was involved in the first automobile accident in American history. The accident occurred in Ohio City, Ohio. Lambert's vehicle, the first single-cylinder gasoline automobile, which was carrying Lambert and James Swoveland, hit a tree root, causing the car to careen out of control and smash into a hitching post. Injuries from this accident were minor. Lambert proceeded to patent over six hundred inventions, mostly affiliated with the automobile industry.
- 2. When did the first fatality in an auto accident occur, and where? This happened way back on August 31, 1869 in Ireland of all places. While riding as a passenger with some relatives in an experimental steam car, Mary Ward was thrown from, and fell under the wheels of the car as it rounded a bend. This is thought to be the first ever recorded automobile death.

# THOUGHTS FROM THE ROAD - Vol II

September 2014

Brian and I recently returned home from our cross-country RV adventure. We were traveling for about two and a half months (9500+ miles) and are excited to be home, but also disappointed that the trip is over. There are several areas of the country we visited that we would enjoy exploring further.

Some observations from the road:

- There seems to be road construction on EVERY highway and interstate, especially during the summer months. Guess they have to do it sometime! California highways are much better than most states. The smoothest stretch of road we traveled on was in Canada.
