And now on to the trivia answers you've just couldn't wait to find out!

Answer One:

• It was dear old Mary Anderson that invented the windshield wiper, (that's right, a GIRL!) in November of 1903. During a trip to New York City, Mary Anderson noticed that streetcar drivers had to open the windows of their cars when it rained in order to see. As a solution she invented a swinging arm device with a rubber blade that was operated from inside the vehicle by the driver using a manual lever.

Answer Two:

• That would be in 1916 when the windshield wiper became standard equipment on all American cars. Ahh yes, we can all see clearly now.

Feel free to attach a flyer. PDF preferred, but jpg or word docs are fine too. The smaller the file size the better! That means it will load faster for those (still quite a few) without high speed connections.
