town" driving (without a big family). It will be very interesting to see if it can meet the target price and mileage when it hits the market later this year.



I know you're all so excited you can't breath, so here are the answers to this months Trivia Ouestions!

- 1. The transmission adopted by most car makers in the early days, was the Panhard-Levassor sliding gear manual transmission, which required coming to a full stop to shift into first gear. It was engineer *Earl A. Thompson* who developed a synchronizing system that permitted drive and driven gears to be brought into mesh with each other smoothly, and without clashing.
- 2. In 1928 Earl's fully synchronized transmission was introduced as standard equipment by his employer, Cadillac. An improvement to the design, patented by Porsche, is still widely used today.
